THE FIRST-TIME FEELING

REDISCOVERING THAT QUIET THRILL OF SOMEWHERE NEW.

There are moments in travel that quietly reset you, not because they're loud or dramatic, but because they remind you how extraordinary the world still is. For me, one of those moments came in Sri Lanka, watching elephants move through their natural environment for the very first time.

We were in Minneriya National Park, there was no rush, no sense of spectacle, just a slow unfolding of the day. Then out of nowhere, they appeared. A small group at first, moving through the landscape, completely unbothered by our presence.

What struck me most wasn't the size of the elephants, although that alone is humbling, but their calm. Calves stayed close, adults moved with confidence, and the entire scene felt



deeply grounded. It wasn't a moment to photograph quickly and move on from. It was one to sit with, to observe, and to absorb. It was one of those moments I've tried to articulate the feeling but there are no words, it is something you need to experience yourself.

That's the kind of first-time feeling I talk about often. Not the adrenaline rush of chasing experiences, but the awe that comes from being present in the right place, at the right time, with the right guidance. Soft adventure, at its best, doesn't ask you to push yourself, it invites you to slow down and notice more.

Even now, I can still feel that quiet sense of privilege that comes from witnessing something so completely as it is meant to be. TRAVEL HACK

HOW TO MAXIMISE YOUR ANNUAL LEAVE IN 2026 – 60 DAYS OFF FOR 24 DAYS' LEAVE

Hack your work calendar next year and take strategic advantage of public holidays to maximise your annual leave in 2026, turning 20 days into 60 days away from the office. Here's your cheat sheet on how to achieve maximum holidays using less leave.

Christmas–New Year: 16 days off with just 7 days' annual leave

With public holidays on Thursday 25 December 2025, Friday 26 December 2025 and 1 January 2026, employees who lock in seven days of annual leave (22–24 December, 29–31 December, and 2 January) can enjoy a 16-day break from Saturday 20 December 2025 through Sunday 4 January 2026.

Australia Day: 9 days off with just 4 days' annual leave

With the public holiday on Monday 26 January, employees who take four annual leave days from Tuesday 27 January to Friday 30 January will gain nine uninterrupted days off from Saturday 24 January to Sunday 1 February.

Easter: 10 days off with just 4 days' annual leave

Good Friday is 3 April and Easter Monday is 6 April, enabling workers to use four leave days from Tuesday 7 April to Friday 10 April and enjoy a 10-day break from 3–12 April. Tasmanian public-service employees also have Easter Tuesday as a public holiday, so they only need three annual leave days.

Mid-year long weekend hacks

King's Birthday on Monday 8 June. Four leave days either side of those Mondays convert each long weekend into nine consecutive days off. Labour Day holidays allow us to repeat the hack: 9 March in Victoria.

Add AFL Grand Final Eve (Friday 25th September) and Melbourne Cup Day (Tuesday 3 November) and Victorians can lock in up to 60 days off.

One extra leave day (Monday 2 November) builds a four-day Cup mini-break, taking the total annual leave tally to 24 days.




Europe-bound travellers should add Killarney, Ireland; Marbella, Spain; and St Julian's, Malta to their lists, according to Amex Travel.

Timing over Intensity

When planning wildlife experiences, prioritise timing over intensity. Early mornings and late afternoons often offer the most meaningful encounters, not because there's more happening, but because everything feels calmer, quieter, and more natural.
